Guidelines for Contributors:

Editorial policy: The *Tolstoy Studies Journal* is a refereed journal and welcomes contributions on any topic relevant to Tolstoy scholarship. In addition to articles, the Journal publishes review articles, roundtable discussions, news and events, notices of work in progress, special reports, and book reviews. Book reviews will normally be invited, but unsolicited reviews may be considered. In the interest of attracting the widest readership possible, the *Journal* publishes manuscripts in English, with Cyrillic text where necessary.

Receipt of the manuscript will be acknowledged, and the author informed as soon as possible whether or not the manuscript has been accepted. The usual deadline for submission is June 1. Special issues may have special deadlines which will be announced in advance.

Style: The manuscript must follow the format outlined in the *MLA Handbook for Writers of Research Papers*. Works cited, endnotes, paragraphing, punctuation, etc. should conform to MLA rules. All titles and emphasis should be indicated by italics rather than underlining.

Transliteration: Russian and other Slavic languages should be transliterated according to the Library of Congress system of transliteration. Well-known Russian surnames which have commonly been transliterated differently in English, e.g., Tolstoy, Tschaikovsky, should be given their standardized form.

Quotations: For technical and editorial reasons the Journal discourages quotations in Russian unless they are absolutely necessary to advance the author's argument. When quotations are given in Russian, English translations must be provided; for Russian quotations, transliteration rather than Cyrillic is preferred for technical reasons. Direct quotations longer than four manuscript lines should be set off from the body of the text by indenting five spaces from the left margin and omitting quotation marks.

Computer generated copy: Authors of submissions accepted for publication will be required to submit final text in IBM-PC compatible format (Word or WordPerfect for Windows, high density diskettes only). Diskettes must be labeled with the name of the file and the exact format used.

Authors of manuscripts accepted for publication will be expected to be members in good standing of the Tolstoy Society.
